Abstract Submission Guidelines

- Abstract submission implies that all authors have read and reviewed the submission.
- Abstract submission deadline date is no later than August 1st 2019.
- Abstracts may be withdrawn but not altered after the deadline.
- Whilst reports of individuals cases (case reports) with unique scientific or educational value will be considered, they must enhance clinical practice or diagnostic understanding to be accepted. In the interest of maintaining high scientific standards only those abstracts passing peer review will be accepted.
- The abstract should include the following elements:
 - Title: (in block capitals)
 - Introduction/Background: a brief discussion of the background or rationale of the study and/or questions addressed
 - Materials and methods: the experimental approach, materials, and methods used in the study
 - Results: the data and results obtained in the study
 - Conclusions: the conclusions and/or implications of the results.
- The main body of the abstract must not exceed 500 words.
